this letter is to certify that you have presented your research on "Surveillance Platforms at Work: data and workers' control in Time Doctor and Teramind" at the 4<sup>th</sup> international Data Power conference hosted by the University of Bremen, the University of Sheffield and Carlton University. The conference took place from June 22<sup>nd</sup> - 24<sup>th</sup> 2022 in Bremen (Germany), Sheffield (UK), Ottawa (Canada) and online. You have presented your research in Bremen.

In 2015, a group of data studies researchers founded the biannual, international Data Power conference to address questions around data power. What kinds of power are enacted when data are employed by governments and security agencies to monitor populations or by private corporations to accumulate knowledge about consumers? Equally important are questions about the possibility of agency in the face of data power and of social groups sidestepping the dominating interests of big business and big government in our big-data-driven world. The first Data Power conference was held in 2015 at the University of Sheffield, organised by Helen Kennedy, Jo Bates and Ysabel Gerrard. In 2017, the second Data Power conference took place at Carleton University in Ottawa, Canada, organised by Tracey Lauriault and Merlyna Lim, with support from the Sheffield conference team. In 2019, with the theme of Global In/securities, the third conference will take place at the University of Bremen in Germany, organised by Andreas Hepp, Juliane Jarke and Leif Kramp from the University of Bremen and Monika Halkort from the Lebanese American University in Beirut, with support from previous conference organisers.
